INQUEST OVER THE BODY OF SAMI FINAZI HELD IN BIRMINGHAM

Sami Finazi, Italian laborer, killed in a street in Birmingham, Ala., by a street car, Saturday morning August 31st, about one forty five o'clock (1:45). Car 1800 with 13 Italian laborers was wrecked by a split switch. Three other laborers were seriously injured one of whom died in a Detroit hospital. Inquest was held Wednesday before Justice A. W. Campbell. The Company did not appear. Very little interest was manifested.
