A new phenomenon. A new phenomenon has been observed by Professor Hight which gives the name of Iono-magnetic rotation. In a spark from a condenser of considerable capacity is sent horizontally through a gas and two small vertical vanes of mica in the form of a cross are suspended in the middle of the discharge of the gas. The cross, established in the gas, the cross travels through a considerable angle in the gas as air, and over a small angle in other gases. Professor Hight describes this rotation to the bending of the paths of the ions or electrons, and to the additional protection which the ions afford each other against impacts from one side rather than from the other in these circumstances. The observed rotations indicate that the cause is a vertical magnetic field of a great magnitude greater than those of the negative.
