Henry, Detroit, 40 shares; William T. Barbour, Bloomfield, 60 shares. The offices of both concerns are to be in Detroit.

BLUE RIBBON RACES

Of the Detroit Driving Club to be Held on the State Fair Grounds Track Aug. 10 to 16.

From the form and speed shown by horses at the earlier grand circuit and Michigan meetings it is evident that there will be exceptionally fast time during the Blue Ribbon trots. Detroit's great midsummer races have an advantage this year in coming later, the week of August 11 to 16 being set apart for the first visit of the famous drivers and sensational trotters and pacers to the Michigan state fair grounds. In the past the Blue Ribbon meetings generally have been held in July, when the number of horses up to their best efforts is much smaller than a month later. Now that the Detroit races are moved back some weeks there will be more horses ready to compete in the rich stakes and purses and they will be able to trot or pace faster than at Cleveland or Pittsburg.

Racing so far this year has been uneventful. Not only did the half-mile track stables go very fast in June and so far this month, but the grand circuit stables are in rare shape. When one considers that a green trotter stepped in 2:04 and a green pacer in 2:34 at Cleveland the possibilities of the future are all attractive.

Horses are being brought along for the Merchants' and Manufacturers' and Chamber of Commerce stakes and other early closing events at Detroit are showing the state fair grounds will be in prime shape for the fast things and time records of all previous Blue Ribbon meetings will fall during the week of August 11 if the weather is at all favorable.

Attendance at races held thus far has been annual, hence it is suggested that those who intend coming to Detroit to witness this annual speed carnival make their hotel reservations in plenty time.

OBITUARY.

SARA WILLETTS LEE. Sara Willetts Lee, daughter of Elish and Rachel Willets, was born in Birmingham, Michigan, February 11, 1848 and passed from earth at dawn July 21, 1913.

Practically the entire history of her native town has transpired in her lifetime. The home in which she died, a modern house, stands in the heart of the village and on the site of the old farm homestead bought of the federal government by her father when Michigan was a territory back in the forest days of Hubbard S. Lee, April 18, 1849, and of this union six children were born: Mrs. Grace Howell, of Caro, Michigan; Fred C., of Thompsonville; Nellie Rowley, deceased; Elmer E., of Detroit; Charles E., of Oronoco; and Mrs. Carrie Brown, of Dunkirk, Montana.

Mrs. Lee was bereaved of her husband in 1901, but nearly twenty years before she had found a personal Savior and wonderful friend in Christ Jesus, whose fellowship made her years of widowhood as well as the long years of her husband's invalidism, years of cheer. A vital faith was sister Lee's, a reality in her life which she gave glad witness to. It lightened her burdens, shortened her sorrows, strengthened her friends and had its fruit in her children. During the past winter a spiritual uplift came to her as it did to many in her home church, and in spite of her advanced age she was frequently present in the special meetings inspiring others by her interest and quaint testimonies. Many beside the circle of her household will share this bereavement, yet rejoice in the triumph of her faith which was unclouded to the end.
