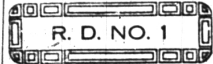

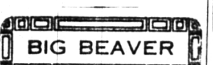

The Miller boys on the Fairview farm are finishing their milk-house and ice-house and Bert Conkin is the boss on the job.

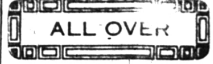
