NO MORE PENNIES

Uncle Sam's Rural Route Carriers no More to be Burdened with Loose Money in Boxes

A burden has been lifted from the shoulders of the rural mail carriers by an order issued by James F. Blakeslee, fourth assistant postmaster general, and approved by other heads of the postal department, abolishing the old loose penny nuisance. By virtue of the new ruling the rural carriers need not accept unstampable letters in boxes, even though the pennies are left with the mail.

The new ruling saves in part: "In rural mail boxes shall be stamped before being deposited. When this is not practical coins left in such boxes for the purchase of stamps should be deposited in coin-holding receptacles and not enclosed in envelopes, wrapped in paper, or left loose in boxes."

By the rural carriers from the Post-office the announcement is hailed with gladness, as loose pennies in the boxes have for many years been one of the most annoying nuisances with which the carriers have had to contend. So general had the practice become, that scarcely ever was a stamped letter found in the boxes.
