The Following Resolutions as Adopted by the Village Council at a Special Meeting Mar. 18.

At a special meeting of the Village Council of Birmingham held on Wednesday evening March 18, at the Council Rooms the following resolutions were offered by Trustee Wedruph, supported by Trustee Wylie.

Resolved: That the village be divided into five fire districts as follows.

District No. 1 shall be a radius of about 500 feet from the center of intersection of Maple and Woodward Avenue's and shall be designated by one blow of the fire whistle in case of fire.

District No. 2 shall be that portion of the village lying North of Maple and West of Woodward Avenue and shall be designated by one long blow and one short blow of the fire whistle in case of fire.

District No. 3 shall be that portion of the village lying North of Maple Avenue and East of Woodward Avenue and shall be designated by one long blow and two short blows of the fire whistle in case of fire.

District No. 4 shall be that portion of the village lying South of Maple Avenue and West of Pierce Street and shall be designated by one long blow and three short blows of the fire whistle in case of fire.

District No. 5 shall be that portion of the village lying South of Maple Avenue and East of Pierce Street and shall be designated by one long blow and four short blows of the fire whistle in case of fire.

CITIZEN'S VIEW OF NEW SCHOOL SITE.

To the Editor:-

It seems to me that the action of the school board in asking for a \$4,000.00 bond issue to purchase a site for the proposed Martha Baldwin school was rather premature. The site suggested on Pierce Street, known as the Spicer property, and it seems to me that if the community had started out to find the poorest site in the village on the lot to locate a high school, they found it. It has only 124 feet frontage on Pierce Street, and would be surrounded on three sides with barns, backyards, sheds and chicken houses. The ground is low and the general outlook is not of the best, as a proper site for a high school it is a joke. The proposition should be turned down until some better site is found. The Parks site, as well as the Dr. Raynolds property was considered. The vacant property on Willett Street near the Baptist church was mentioned, it is understood that the price of that property is about \$2,000.00.

Better turn the bond issue down and take a little more time in finding a proper location. At all events there should be no rush as it will be from three to five years before the school will be built, in the mean time we will lose the taxes on the property and pay about \$240, a year as interest on the \$4,000.00 bonds.
