FIRE! FIRE! FIRE!

The Following Resolutions as Adopted by the Village Council at a Special Meeting Mar. 18.

At a special meeting of the Village Council of Birmingham held on Wednesday evening March 18 at the Council Rooms the following resolutions were offered by Trustee Wendrup, supported by Trustee Wyle:

Resolved: That the village be divided into five fire districts as follows:

District No. 1 shall be a radius of about 500 feet from the center or intersection of Maple and Woodward Avenue and shall be designated by one long blow of the fire whistle in case of fire.

District No. 2 shall be that portion of the village lying north of Maple and West of Woodward Avenue and shall be designated by one long blow and one short blow of the fire whistle in case of fire.

District No. 3 shall be all that portion of the village lying North of Maple Avenue and East of Woodward Avenue and shall be designated by one long blow and two short blows of the fire whistle in case of fire.

District No. 4 shall be that portion of the village lying south of Maple Avenue and West of Pierce Street and shall be designated by one long blow and three short blows of the fire whistle in case of fire.

District No. 5 shall be all that portion of the village lying south of Maple Avenue and East of Pierce Street and shall be designated by one long blow and four short blows of the fire whistle in case of fire.
