Great Preacher Productive.
A wonderful sermon maker was C.
H. Spurgeon. He had no need to re-
peat himself, for his powers seemed
inexhaustible, and moreover, he made
repetition impossible by publishing his
sermons week by week. The weekly
issue began in 1861, and though the
great preacher died in 1891, he left
behind so much material that the pub-
lication has continued till this day,
and is likely to go on for at least an
other dozen years. No other pub-
lished sermons ever attained such
popularity as Spurgeon's. One sermon
alone sold over 2,000,000 copies.

His Thrilling Experience.

outful autobiography: "I am eleven
years old. When I was three I had
the scarlet fever. After that I had
mumps, measles and whooping
cough, soon a great danc jumped and
bit my face and then I fell off of a
ladder and broke my arm. Mother
