An Ordinance

Prohibiting the raising of large domestic fowls.

The Village of Birmingham Ordinance: Section 1. That any person who shall after the first day of April and before the first day of November in each year raise or permit to be raised on his or her domestic fowls raised by him or her, any fowls of any breed or variety, shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor, and shall pay to the Village Clerk the following fine, to wit: For each fowl, \$5.00 per item.

For each Poultry, \$10.00 per annum or \$1.00 per item.

Birds of Fruit or Vegetables, \$25.00 per annum, or \$1.00 per item.

Small Fowls of Poultry, \$5.00 per item.

Hucksters, \$5.00 per item.

Section 2. Upon the receipt by the Village Clerk of the license fee hereinbefore provided, the said Clerk shall issue to the person applying therefor a license, which shall show authority in the person to whom it is issued, to raise or permit to be raised on his or her domestic fowls, and shall also show the date of expiration of the license.

Section 3. Any person violating any of the provisions of this ordinance and being convicted thereof shall pay a fine of not more than \$20.00 together with the costs of prosecution or shall be confined in the County Jail for a period of not more than thirty days or both, such term of imprisonment to be at the discretion of the court.

Section 4. This ordinance shall take effect on the fourth day of May, A. D. 1914.

Section 5. All ordinances and resolutions heretofore passed and resolutions hereafter to be passed, which are in conflict with the provisions of this ordinance are hereby repealed.

An Ordinance

Regulating and Licensing Auctioneers, Hucksters, Peddlers, Vendors, Curriers, etc., and repealing all ordinances in connection therewith.

The Village of Birmingham Ordinance: Section 1. That before any person as herein defined shall engage in the business of an auctioneer, a peddler, a huckster, or shall operate or maintain any stand, booth, or any other contrivance, he shall pay to the Village Clerk the following license fee, to wit: Auctioneer, \$5.00 per item.

Best Peddler, \$10.00 per annum or \$1.00 per item.

Seller of Fruit or Vegetables, \$25.00 per annum, or \$1.00 per item.

Small Fowls of Poultry, \$5.00 per item.

Hucksters, \$5.00 per item.

Section 2. Upon the receipt by the Village Clerk of the license fee hereinbefore provided, the said Clerk shall issue to the person applying therefor a license, which shall show authority in the person to whom it is issued, to engage in the business of an auctioneer, peddler, etc., and shall also show the date of expiration of the license.

Section 3. Any person violating any of the provisions of this ordinance and being convicted thereof shall pay a fine of not more than \$20.00 together with the costs of prosecution or shall be confined in the County Jail for a period of not more than thirty days or both, such term of imprisonment to be at the discretion of the court.
