Arrangements have been concluded by the management of the new Orpheum theatre, at Lafayette boulevard and Shelby street, Detroit, for a rearrangement of the hours of performance at this popular playhouse. It is planned to give only two performances of vaudeville daily, this part of the program starting at 2:15 o'clock in the afternoon and at 8:15 o'clock at night.
