Council Proceedings

Regular adjourned meeting, July 2, 1915.

Present: President Philip Schlaack, Thomas E. Harris, acting clerk. Trustees present: Hewitt, Clizbe, Brown, Jones.

Trustees absent: Bailey and Harde. Hewitt moved, Clizbe seconded, that the village clerk be instructed to place an order with the R. D. Baker Co. to extend their concrete pavement at the south village line in the north side of Willow avenue six feet north with Woodward avenue at the unit price as per their contract for Woodward avenue between Royal Oak and Birmingham.

Ayes—Jones, Brown, Hewitt, Clizbe, Nays—None. Motion carried.

Hewitt moved, Jones seconded, that the village clerk be instructed to place an order with the Trussed Concrete Steel Co. for approximately 31,000 square yards of Kalm Road mesh, for reinforcing 6x12 inches, No. 25, at 8c per square yard, for immediate delivery, T. O. B. Birmingham.

Ayes—Jones, Brown, Hewitt, Clizbe, Nays—None. Motion carried.

Clizbe moved, Jones seconded, that Clarence A. Proctor, asphalt expert of Detroit, be engaged as chemist to furnish analysis and reports of asphaltic surface material used in paving Woodward and Maple avenues. He to be paid at the standard rate of two (2) cents per square yard of paving laid.

Ayes—Jones, Brown, Hewitt, Clizbe, Nays—None. Motion carried.

Moved by Hewitt, seconded by Brown, that the village clerk instruct the Andrews Asphaltic Paving Co. to increase the width of the Woodward avenue

pavement to 50 feet from Station 37+00 to Station 50+00 as shown on plans.

Moved by Hewitt, seconded by Brown, that the village clerk advise the Andrews Asphaltic Paving Co. that the council has ordered the concrete foundation to be cut from 6 inch thickness to 5 inch, thus saving to the village 1-36 grading and 10c per square yard on the concrete paving, also that they are to lay the Kalm road mesh reinforcing to be furnished by the village for an extra cost of 2c per square yard, as per agreement by their Mr. Harbit.
