European War News

A total of 1,229,171 military prisoners are held by Germany, according to the German News Agency at Berlin. In addition, 19,700 cannon, 3,000 machine guns and 1,300,000 rifles fit for use.

The announcement in London that Earl Kitchener had been supposed as chief strategist for the British army by Sir William Robertson, now chief of staff, was followed by reports that the hero of Khartoum is to leave the war office. Sir Robertson will remain in absolute charge of the direction of the expeditionary forces.

Prince Oscar of Prussia, fifth son of Emperor William, has been awarded a slightly in the head and on the upper part of the right by shell splinters during the fighting in the eastern war theater, according to German official report received at Amsterdam.

M. Radovitch, the Montenegrin minister in Rome, has requested the American Red Cross society to undertake the feeding of the people displaced in Montenegro. There are 20,000 persons in the country, he says, without food.

Four hundred and fifty Germans, at least 1,000 tons, were killed by the British air force. The report adds that the crew with the exception of the second officer was saved.

The first infantry clash between the forces of the central powers and the allies since the latter concentrated in Saloniki occurred on the Balkan front, according to a dispatch to Reuters from the Telegraph company at London from Saloniki. The casualties were slight.

The foreign office at London made public the correspondence exchanged between the British and German officials with regard to the transfer of the ship "Lusitania" from the British to the German flag. The document shows that the British government has guaranteed that the native stocks will not be drawn upon to maintain the armaments of the country.

An official communication from Berlin adds Zeppelin LZ14 has not returned to a reconnaissance flight and that inquiries concerning the airship have been fruitless. Reports from Amsterdam confirm the fact that the airship has been lost at sea.

Avlons and Durazzo, the two chief cities of Albania, were bombarded from the air by Austro-Hungarian aeroplanes. One of the hydroplanes that attacked Avlons was destroyed, but its two occupants were rescued.

Domestic

Two trainmen were killed when the engine and tender of a Big Four passenger train plunged into the Wabash river. The dead are Engineer Frank Lancaster and Fireman Oliver Hazelton, both of Mount Carmel, Ill.

Six women were burned to death when fire destroyed the house at 243 Hancock street, Brooklyn. The house was the home of Mrs. Estlin Tag, widow of Cassin Tag, who was president of the German Savings bank.

When Armina Conzo, Italian consul, banker for the local Italian community, employment agent opened his door in the Wayland apartment at Milwaukee it fired a bomb set for him and he barely escaped with his life.

Edward Holler, Alexander Aceci, Charles Houghton, George O'Mark and Thomas C. Rogers, former owners of Terre Haute, Ind., convicted in the election conspiracy case, were released from the Leavenworth (Kan.) penitentiary.

A roadhouse in Burnham, Ill., was burned to the ground. Rose Staley, the barmaid, was burned to death, and another woman and four men were injured. The roadhouse is located on the Illinois side of the Illinois-Indiana state line.

Charles Strony, a musical director of the Chicago Grand Opera company, was arrested on the Canadian border as a suspect in the alleged bomb plot which wrought the destruction of the "enchantment building" in Ottawa, with the loss of seven lives.

The largest equipment order given in any railroad for several years was authorized at Chicago by directors of the Illinois Central railroad. The contract, as drawn, calls for \$2,000,000 which will cost nearly \$2,000,000.

A book containing the secret code of the United States navy has been lost from the torpedo boat destroyer "Albatross" and, according to messages received at San Francisco from Washington, the code was a Chicago-based engineer who was in the United States navy yard of two naval officers.
