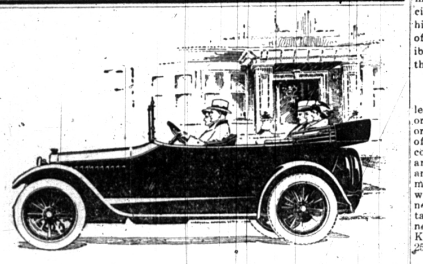

ABOUT AUCTIONS.

M. E. Bland, auctioneer, says: "Public sales are like marriages in one respect, a person doesn't expect to become a victim more than six or eight times during his life, therefore it is necessary to note the following points:—

1. Advertise well—having secured a date with your auctioneer, will make your local paper an advertisement describing your property well and just at it is. Don't exaggerate. Ten days before day of sale, get a good supply of large ad show bills and post them everywhere.

2. Have everything arranged in the best possible manner. It will then be convenient for your auctioneer, and money in your pocket, from the selling of the old broom at the house to the price you get at the barn.

3. Have horses cleaned and slicked up for show, and a good, bright man to handle them in the ring. Have sheep and hogs graded and penned in small lots; have cows and heifers tagged and numbered; all farm implements, wagons, and buggies in a separate circle.

4. Have a competent, quick clerk, who knows everybody. Have a good lunch, plenty for all; well filled bottles jolled up by the auctioneer; will make your audience? Have no coopers or fly-bidders. Be good-natured, level-headed, attend strictly to business all day and have good help. Your auctioneer is bound to do his level best and you will doubtless be a good sale.

RURAL CARRIER EXAMINATION.

The United States Civil Service Commission has announced an examination for the County of Oakland, Michigan, to be held at Pontiac and Oxford on March 11, 1916, to fill the position of rural carrier at Birmingham and vacancies that may later occur on rural routes from other post offices in the above mentioned county. The examination will be open only to male citizens who are or have been domiciled in the territory of a post office in the county and who meet the other requirements set forth in Form No. 1977. This form and application blanks may be obtained from the office mentioned above or from the United States Civil Service Commission at Washington, D. C. Applications should be forwarded to the Commission at Washington at the earliest practicable date.
