A special Court of Honor will be constructed where all the booths and exhibits will be located. Money derived from the sale of the booths will help to pay the cost of the Centennial. Needless to say, an undertaking of this nature requires an adequate fund, the entire cost of which is estimated at \$30,000. Under the chairmanship of Miss Sadie Sly, Bloomfield is doing her share and in the front ranks.

The general program for the week, August 20 to 26 inclusively as follows: August 20, Church Day—Sermons will be preached in the churches on the growth of the House of God during the past 100 years.

August 21, Women's Day—Reception of Visitors; Dedication of Three Historical Tablets; Baby Show in High School gymnasium; and Water Carnival at night.

August 22, Fraternal Day—Fraternal Orders will parade; Special Band Concert; big Electric Illuminated Pageant of Progress at night.

August 23, Oratorical Day—Governor Ferris, United States Senators William Alden Smith, Charles Tamm, and Charles A. Towne, and Congressman Patrick H. Kelly will speak. At night, a Special Choral Program.

August 24, Historical Day—Large Pageant of Floats, one from each township depicting the history of Oakland County, from the time of the earliest settlers. In the evening, a Massed Band Concert.

August 25, Commercial Day—Industrial Parade. At night Pageant of Progress will be repeated.

August 26, Labor Day—Parade of Labor Unions. At night big Confetti Battle and Fireworks; Annual Boat Club Syllabus.
