A FORCE OF UNITED STATES CALVARY ALONG THE MEXICAN BORDER

Major General Funston ordered the war department at Washington that the time has come for immediate action in Mexico.

Orders to take Villa dead or alive went forward from Washington to Major Gen. Frederick Funston on the Mexican border.

The report that Villa led the attack in the raid on Columbus, N. M., in the afternoon of the 20th, was confirmed by several persons who have seen him and a portfolio containing many of his papers was found.

Gen. P. Elias Calles, military governor of Sonora, who arrived at Agua Prieta, the Mexican town, opposite Douglas, Ariz., said he had come to supervise the campaign against Francisco Villa.

A declaration of war against Germany by Italy is imminent, according to the Berliner Post.

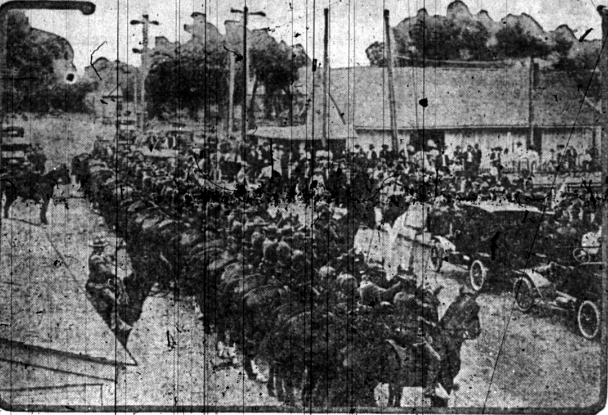

House Passes Bill to Bring the Regular Army up to Full Strength and Votes 20,000 More Men

12,000 Soldiers on Border. Columbus, N. M. - Approximately 12,000 troops with 40 mountain and field gun batteries were on the border between Douglas Ariz. and El Paso, a line about 200 miles long.

COMMANDS AMERICAN ARMY

Washington - Brigadier John Pershing will be the field commander of the United States troops in Mexico.

It is being decided that General Houston will direct the army movements and not take personal command in the field.

Carrazna's Threat. Rising to tolerate American troops in Mexico unless the U. S. allows Mexican troops in America for similar purposes should it become necessary, President Carranza of Mexico says.

"I am sure that I interpret in this matter the national sentiment, and that the Mexican people will comply in a dignified manner with their duty, the sacrifices that they may, to sustain their rights and sovereignty."

"We will not be responsible for the disastrous consequences. Upon the heads of the traitorous Mexicans, who within and without this country have labored to produce this result, will fall the inexorable justice of the people."

Villa Moves Eastward. El Paso, Tex. - Francisco Villa has suddenly moved eastward, according to reports received by General Carranza, Mexican commander at Juarez.

This move apparently takes Villa away from the territory in which his troops have been active for some time, and distant from the point where the concentration of American troops has been heaviest.

New York - Disregard of British admiralty instructions caused destruction of the steamship Maloja of the Peninsular & Oriental line (see), which struck a mine off the coast of the Canary Islands, Feb. 28, according to passengers on the Canadian liner Pannonia, which arrived in New York.
