1916 EXPOSITION PUTS FOOT IN IT 25 YEARS AGO

Mr. Dickinson Assures It a Show Which Will Outclass All Previous Efforts.

G. W. Dickinson, General Manager of the Michigan State Fair, announces that the next Exposition will be held on September 4 to 13 inclusive.

Mr. Dickinson says that plans for the 1916 Exposition are well under way and that Michigan residents can be assured a show which will outclass all previous efforts.

Several speakers of national-wide prominence have been invited to make addresses. A body-building contest with lectures by physicians and experts on physical culture will be innovations.

Completed already have arrangements for automobile races, aeroplane flights, harness horse races, entertaining mid-way shows, various attractions, and the popular Evening Horse Show will include many new features.

"We expect that practically every State institution, which has anything it can display, will be represented at our Fair with an exhibit," said Mr. Dickinson. "I have received letters from the heads of nearly all the State schools, reformatories, and other institutions assuring me they would be pleased to make exhibits at our 1916 Exposition."
