European War News

Nuri Bey, brother of Enver Pasha, Turkish war minister, was killed in the battle between British and Turkish troops and Turkish tribesmen in western Egypt, according to a report of the fighting received at London. Germany has addressed a sharp note to the German merchant vessels by the Portuguese authorities. This measure is characterized as a violation of Germany's treaty rights and is expressed as a warning that Portugal will rescind her action.

The sinking of the hospital ship *Meschiachro*, near San Giovanni di Modena, Albania, is reported in a dispatch to London. The vessel struck a mine. There were numerous victims.

The *Premier* and Oriental Liner steamship *Majala*, 12,451 tons gross, was sunk in the Straits of Dover by mine. One hundred and forty-seven persons perished, of whom 117 were Lascars. The steamship *Empress of Fort William*, while attempting to rescue the survivors of the *Majala*, struck another mine and sank in less than half an hour. The crew was saved.

Five determined attempts made by French troops to recapture from the German Fort de Doumouant, one of the outlying Verdun fortifications, were repulsed with singular losses, according to a report received at Paris. The assault was made at Berlin by the German headquarters staff. The number of wounded Frenchmen taken prisoners, it was added, totaled 15,000.

Austro-Hungarian troops took full possession of the Albanian port of Durazzo, which had been partially occupied at Vlorë. Recent dispatches reported that all Italian troops have been withdrawn from Durazzo.

Four British steamers have been sunk with the loss of 137 lives, according to a dispatch from London. The *Wilson liner Dido* was the largest victim.

A Reuter dispatch to London from Petrograd says the Russians have taken by storm Kermanchay, the important Persian city in the neighborhood of which serious fighting recently has taken place.

A Turkish column was attacked and routed by South African troops at Agagia, Egypt, according to a British official statement issued at London, which adds that the fleeing Turks are being pursued.

Gen. Alexei Kurukapkin has been appointed commander in chief of the Russian armies on the northern front, according to a dispatch from Petrograd. General Kurukapkin succeeds General Raskov.

Sixty-seven men, women and children were killed and 117 wounded during the German air raid on England on January 31, says an official statement issued by the government at London.

An official statement issued at Vienna says: "The Italians east and southeast of Durazzo have been driven to the Isthmus west of the Durazzo lakes. Seven hundred Italians were captured."

The German steamer *Hochfeld*, which was interned at Madras early in the war, has escaped, according to a dispatch to London from Puchan.

Thirty-six German and Austrian merchant steamers entered Port of the Hague during the month of January, as a result of information reaching the government that some of them were being prepared for a dash to sea to prey upon the allies' commerce.

LETTER FROM STATE CAPITOL

THE FINAL ASSESSMENT OF PUBLIC UTILITIES CO.'S SHOW INCREASES.

TAX INCREASE TEN MILLIONS

County Treasurers to Be "Jacked Up" On Prompt Remittances As Daily Balance Interest Is Large.

Lansing—Final assessment of public utility companies of Michigan for 1915, as adopted by the state tax commission, shows the properties to be valued at \$25,404,200. Of this property the state will collect in taxes \$2,555,867.23, all of which, under the provisions of the Michigan constitution, goes into the primary school fund. The state board of education has assessed the value of the properties \$37,555,200 over last year, and the additional tax to be collected amounts to \$355,463.66.

After the tentative assessments were announced January 15, representatives of the various companies were given an opportunity to appear before the commission with suggestions as to the correctness of the assessments. Several of the companies sent men to Lansing for this purpose, but none of the properties comparatively few changes were made. The commission paid \$64,000 off the valuation of the railroad properties, but none of the railroads benefited to any great extent.

The final assessment of all real property is \$24,112,000 and the taxes amount to \$2,410,428.64. Sleeping car companies are assessed at \$70,000 and their taxes total \$1,429.53. Express companies doing business in Michigan are valued at \$1,610,000 and the taxes amount to \$1,363.20. Car lines and busines are assessed at \$2,486,700 and the taxes will be \$581,559.62.

According to figures compiled by the state commission, the total tax levy in Michigan is \$6,056,921.07 as compared to \$6,011,361.33 for the previous twelve months.
