

FREE DELIVERYS COMING HERE MORE TROUBLE HIT BY TROLLEY

Started Monday, May 1, and Found Public Indifferent and Almost Totally Unprepared.

Dr. Lloyd G. Campbell, Surgeon at Soldiers' Home, Leavenworth, Kansas, Has Resigned.

Bert D. Bird, His Auto, and a Strange Auto in a Bad Mix-up. Result of Reckless Speeding.

An Unknown Boy Killed Instantly by a Northbound Interurban Car. Still Unidentified.

In spite of all our instructions, notifications, and warnings to be fully prepared, less than fifty per cent of mail receivers were not yet ready with correct house numbers and mail boxes ready on the side of the house for the carriers to deliver their mail.

Captain Lloyd G. Campbell, senior assistant surgeon at the National Soldiers' Home, has tendered his resignation to the board of managers, to take effect, May 24. He expects to leave, the latter part of May, to locate in Birmingham, Michigan, where he will be associated with his father, Dr. J. L. Campbell, in the practice of medicine at that place.

Bert Bird has just passed through another episode. Episode 2, reel 4. Running smoothly along towards home Tuesday Bird D. Bird near John K. Adams' home saw coming towards him on nine points, at least 20 miles an hour, a big car with two men in it. Stiffing danger he drew his car off the road and waited until they had passed. The fast fellows pulled on passed a big touring car, and that car was completely into him. The machine continued on, skidded across the road twice, and did both hind tires, and on the second quick turn threw one of the men twenty feet into Adams' yard, up against an apple tree, almost dead from the usage and fright. During this wild fight the machine snarled at the sight of a house, and a total wreck. At this writing the names of the spectators are not known.

A greatly dressed lad, apparently ten years old, took his life Tuesday forenoon by stepping in front of a northbound car when he was instantly killed. This accident occurred in front of Yroba's Landa, Dr. F. W. Young's home, two miles south of Lud village. It is said the lad was walking between the tracks, with his hands covering his ears, and just before the car reached him, suddenly stepped to the center of the track on which the car was coming. His skull was crushed in on the back of his head and one leg was crushed by the car crew and brought to the undertakers, Messrs. Damms & Bill, where it was tenderly cared for awaiting identification. The boy's name was Shaw in his auto patrolled Woodward avenue seven miles trying to find the dead boy's parents, causing a lot of writing, Wednesday, his identification is not known.
