

NEW PENSION LAW

Stated by Congressman Patrick H. Kelley About the Widows' New Pension Law.

To the Editor:

Through your courtesy, I would like to call attention of widows of Civil War soldiers to the new pension law which has just taken effect, the so-called Ashbrook Law.

This law will benefit the following classes of widows of Civil War soldiers:

1. Any widow heretofore entitled to \$12 will be given an increase to \$20 if she married the soldier prior to his military service.
2. Any widow entitled to \$12 will be given an increase to \$20 if she is 70 years old or over.
3. Any widow who was the widow of a soldier and later remarried and has again been widowed either by divorce or her application without fault, or by death, can now secure a pension.
4. Any widow of Civil War soldier, who married such soldier prior to June 27, 1905, can now secure a pension. The limitation formerly was June 27, 1890, but has now been changed to June 27, 1905.

Any widow who thinks she will be benefited by any of the provisions of the law, if she will write me at Lansing and state the facts of her case, I will inform her also her rights under the law furnish her the necessary blanks and look after the matter for her at the Bureau of Pensions. This being a part of my official duties, no charge will be made to any widow for such service, and I will be very glad to render it.

JUDGE ROCKWELL

Reputation of Judge N. P. Rockwell for Fairness Surpassed by None in State, Says Writer.

In connection with the announcement of Judge K. P. Rockwell's candidacy for another term as Probate Judge, it gives this paper great satisfaction to voice the general approval which the people of the county stand ready to give the splendid administration as one of the most important of our county offices, at the August primary and the November election.

Judge Rockwell has a genial personality, which has made for himself sincere friendships among all who have come in contact with him, either in a social, business, or administrative way.

But as a judge, responsible for the handling of estates totaling in value very closely those of the largest county of the state, he has established a reputation for fairness and correct judicial decisions not to be surpassed in the state, and here we may say that the judge has never had one of his decisions finally reversed by the upper courts.

Under Judge Rockwell, the expenses of probating the estates coming before the court have been decreased over that of former years, saving on items which have been of direct benefit to widows and orphans who are obliged to take, oftentimes, small properties through this court. Another commendable feature of Judge Rockwell's administration is his handling of the juvenile problem which the state puts up to the probate courts of the state, and here in Oakland County the position of the judge is that children coming to this court at an age when their future making or undoing is possible in a life issue that they are not treated as criminals but be given help and a chance to regain their lost foothold, a position which is so greatly aided by the people and one that has worked out with so great benefit in cases without number.

Judge Rockwell is held with excellent satisfaction, the office of prosecuting attorney, re-elected on his record as many times as he was willing to serve the people in that capacity, has been recognized and honored by his associates by the presence of the state association of probate judges. He is now serving as probate judge for the second term, and we predict, if he will consent, that our people, recognizing the benefit of his judgment and experience, will treat Oakland County's probate judge as Wayne County has Judge Durfee, who has been continued at the head of their probate court for over forty years.—Orion Review.
