## CHILD WELFARE

Saturday, September 16, is "Heart Day" in Birmingham. Help the Unfortunate Children.

The Michigan Child Welfare League, of Detroit, will conduct a Tag Day in Birmingham, Saturday, September 16, with headquarters in the Birmingham Council Rooms.

The Michigan Child Welfare League is doing a much needed work throughout the state and is demonstrating that it is not necessary for a child to go through life dependent on the charity of others because of physical handicap. The society seeks out these crippled children, often in the most isolated portions of the state, and sees to it that they have medical and surgical aid which fits them to be self-supporting in the years to come. The organization works with the family as a unit, and every effort is made to hold families together where poverty is the principal cause for separation of children from parents.

The aim of the organization is to teach people in all communities the value of social work to the community, the state, and the nation. The work is state-wide and non-sectarian.
