There is not only the pleasure of working among the plants and flowers, but there is preparation for the spring. If the autumn is neglected there will be no realization of any spring hopes. Perennials must be transplanted. Good, safe places are to be found for them, with a good covering of leaves to keep away the chill of cold days.

A trowel of manure under each plant will lead the neighbors next spring to wonder why your tulips next year are so big and start to bloom in the spring. Nowhere else on earth exists such a depression into the surface of the earth, from 1,000 to 4,000 feet deep. The canyon of the Yellowstone is trifling in comparison with the Grand canyon of the Colorado river in Arizona. The great gorge is 217 miles long, varying from 9 to 13 miles in width, the maximum depth being 6,000 feet. Here the tourist stands at the top of the mountain peak at the start and to gain the Victoria land must descend 4,000 feet of sheer rock.

Elsewhere, we stand at the feet of the mountains and must ascend. At Grand canyon the miles that regulate tourists are reversed in everything. CARRAZZA TROOPS PURSUE BANDITS

SEVERAL HUNDRED BODIES OF MEN AND ANIMALS RETRIEVED FROM STREETS AFTER FIGHT.

VILLA THREE MILES AWAY

Four Separate Attacks Were Launched Against Chihuahua After the People Retired For the Night.

Chihuahua City, Mexico.—Forees of government soldiers have been detailed to bring order out of the chaos upon Villa's Hidalgo day attack. Several hundred bodies of men and animals have been removed from the streets and buried outside the city. Buildings which suffered from gunfire are being repaired. Scores of workmen are engaged in restoring the city's telephone and telegraphic communications. Twenty prisoners taken in the quarrels have been executed. These include M. Chao, formerly Villa's chief of staff, and Mariano Tamayo, who, as a colonel in Juarez, recently attempted unsuccessfully to induce the garrison there to revolt.

The federal unit municipal districts suffered most heavily in the engagement. Huge troops in the plaza before the city were struck by the steady stream of lead poured through them. The bandits tore their horses inside the palace and tore from their manes costly saddles, girths and bridles. Furniture was broken into splinters and doors pulled from their hinges.

Although numerous rumors were current that the city was to be attacked the report was not generally credited. After the engagement, it developed that throughout the night before Villa's men had been listening to the excitement of the independence day celebration and awaiting the signal to attack.

The Carranza troops were launched at the town after their residents had retired for the night. In a dishing raid, just before dawn the outlaws crept from their hiding places and charged in on the Carranza sentries. One force made for the penitentiary, where the release of the prisoners was effected. Another force attempted to break into the barracks, but a third made for the palace, apparently in an attempt to seize ammunition. Stores believed to have been concealed there. The fourth column made a school house open as a barracks.

Prisoners taken in the engagement said they were led by Villa, Mariano Lopez, and the substitute chiefs, Francisco Trevino and Francisco Padilla and that all Villa participated actively in the fighting. The bandit leader, on a hill three miles to the northwest was seen with field glasses in the hands of the Carranza.

TWO DIE IN AUTO ACCIDENT
