I live on the rim of the bay myself, only two blocks away, so, with all due respect to those Germans who may be loyal to the land of their adoption, I shall still feel quite literally, "between the devil and the deep—lake!"

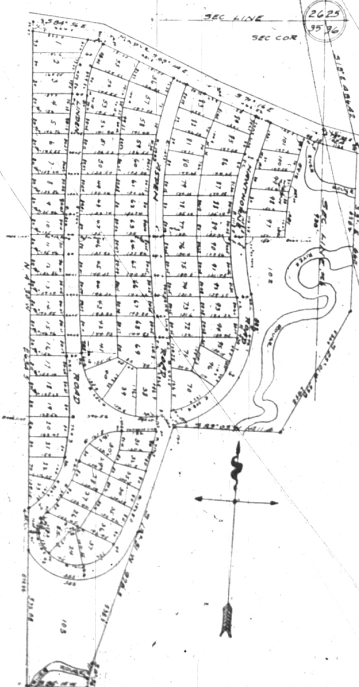
