AN ORDINANCE
ESTABLISHING FIRE LIMITS, REGULATING THE PREVENTION OF FIRES, PROVIDING FOR THE ALLOCATION OF THE WATER SUPPLY, AND REGULATING THE MOVING OF BUILDINGS ON ALLEYS WITHIN THE CITY OF BIRMINGHAM, MICHIGAN.

The Village of Birmingham ordinance section 7. The fire limits of the Village of Birmingham shall be as follows: Beginning at the corner of Woodward avenue and White street, thence West to the White street Bridge, thence south to a point 150 feet West of Woodward Avenue, thence South to Brown street, thence east on Brown street to the corner of Fifth street, thence East on Fifth street to Elm street, thence North on Elm street to the corner of Oakland avenue, thence West to Woodward Avenue.

Section 2. Within the fire limits designated in the ordinance by section 7 of this ordinance, no building shall be erected, altered or repaired, nor shall any building be altered or repaired, nor shall any building be altered or repaired, nor shall any building be altered or repaired.

Section 3. The chief Marshal of the Village of Birmingham shall be a citizen of the State of Michigan, and shall be appointed by the Board of Aldermen and shall hold office for a term of three years, and shall be eligible for re-election.

Section 4. No person shall be permitted to store, keep, use or handle any explosive, volatile or combustible materials, or any other material, which is dangerous to life or property, except as may be provided for by the laws of the State of Michigan.

Section 5. No person shall be permitted to store, keep, use or handle any explosive, volatile or combustible materials, or any other material, which is dangerous to life or property, except as may be provided for by the laws of the State of Michigan.

Section 6. Any person who shall negligently or willfully violate any part of the ordinance herein provided for, shall be punished by a fine not exceeding \$100, or imprisonment in the county jail not exceeding 30 days, or both, at the discretion of the court. The ordinance shall take effect on the 1st day of August, 1917.
