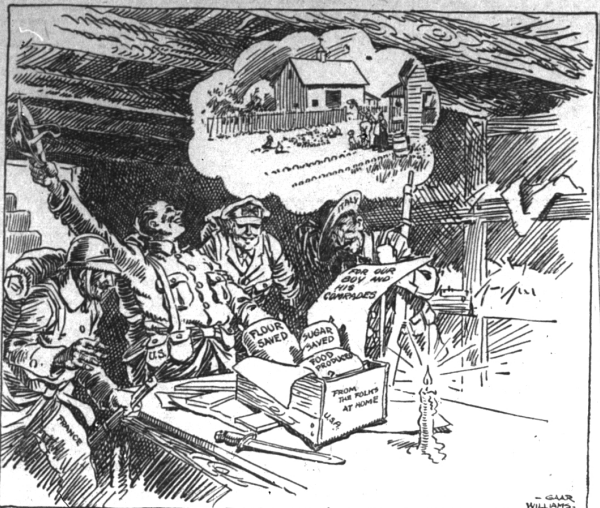


A BOX FROM HOME

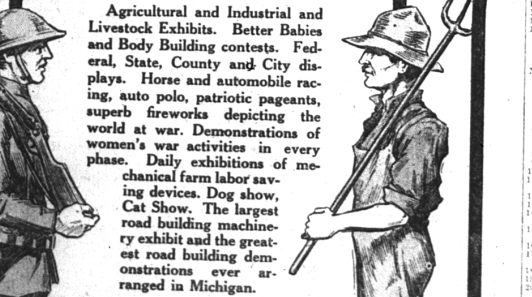
