THE PRESIDENT BRINGS SOME PERTINENT FACTS TO THE ATTENTION OF MICHIGAN PEOPLE. NATIONAL WAR SAVINGS DAY IS SET. Michigan's Full Quota of \$70,000,000 Must Be Fulfilled by June 22. The Government's Thrift Plan is Explained.
