go further.

Don't throw away meat left-overs. The tiny bits of myest or the small amount of meat lightor will add a meat laste to other foods and reconcile someone to the substitution of other protein foods for the meat to which he is accuationed.

Second, get into the habit of serving meat substitutes in the place of meat. There are certain foods which, will give the body very much the same kind of nourishment as does meat. Milk, eggs, cheese, beans and peas, outs, fish and poultry will do this. Use these often.

USE SOUPS.
