Ford Takes Lead, Then Newberry-Pilling up a majority of more than 20,000 in Detroit and Wayne County, Henry Ford today cut down the Tuesday night lead of Tyuman H. Newberry for United States Senator. At noon, however, when the up-state councies began to come in, the Navy man crept ahead of the Ragle builder. Newberry now has a majority of less than 2,000 with returns complete from 29 counties. Representative partial returns are included from all but 11 of the S2 counties. The figures follow: Newberry, 161,488; Perd. 180,178. Majority 1,372.
