

GET OUTSIDE WATER SUPPLY

Such is conclusion reached by local committee after first of wells.

That Birmingham must go further from home to secure a supply of water adequate for local needs is the opinion reached this week by the committee which recently has been investigating the local source of supply headed by W. D. Brown of Orchard. This opinion was arrived at after a study of the present situation and was strengthened as the result of a test of the wells at present furnishing the supply. Just this night at the same place the committee, which has a subcommittee of the general committee headed by Clarence V. Iot of Birmingham, which has been investigating the water supply, made a test to make a report to the effect of the test of the general committee. The test developed the fact that the flow would shut down during the day when the water level in the well was probably would be reduced to about 200 feet. This would mean that Birmingham should have a supply of about one million gallons daily to meet the needs of the city. It is probable that the water level in the well has fallen to such an extent that the pumps have to lift the water a height of about 225 feet. It is possible that, to meet industrial needs, it will be necessary to install electrically operated pumps near the present water level.

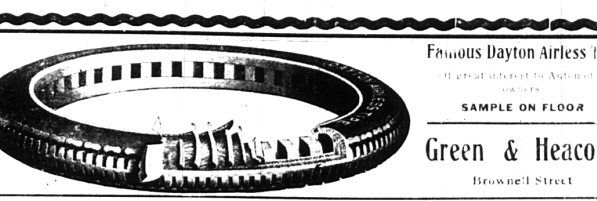
