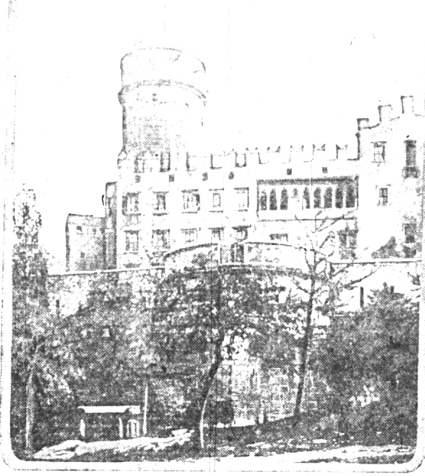

TRENT, in the upper valley of the Adige, has just been restored to Italy, and at the same time the Italian army has been ordered to leave the town.

Only through centuries of careful work with low and high has it been possible to create the garden that extends from the Venetian plain to the inaccessible mountain valleys. Many times away where the ruggedness of the hills and the attempt at farming.
