There are some straw hats that may be washed with safety. A shape which does not contain glue or shellac may be cleaned in this way. First dip the hat thoroughly into water and scrub the brim with a brush. Then make a solution of soap and water and scrub the hat with a wet brush. When it is dry rub over it with a mixture of one egg yolk and a tablespoon of oil.

Children's clothes in the winter, for which wool is the best material, should be washed with soap and water. The washing should be done in a tub or in a large tub.
