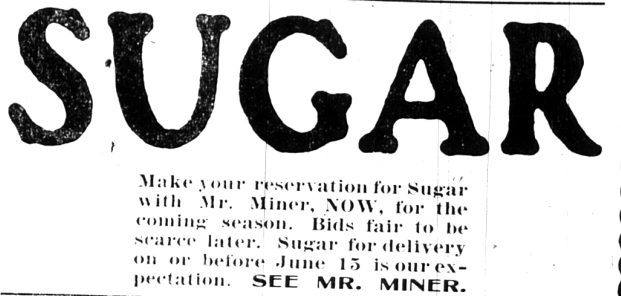

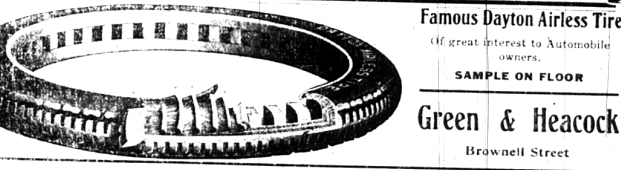

No one any longer questions the value of Boston Rice as a grain crop. It has so far outyielded the native sort that it stands in a class all by itself. Boston Rice has become the staple and not the exception as a grain crop in the rice areas. Owing to its tendency to mix with native stock most of the rice in this country is badly bred with native grain. The broken and irregular heads tell the story. The husk stock falls behind the pure stock in yield as well as an ability to stand. We are anxious to get in touch with all Boston Rice growers, and have secured the type of rice from inspected stock in the last year or two. Such grain, with uniformly two rows of kernels in the head and quite uniform in the row, is to be made in demand another fall for seed. To be eligible for inspection Boston Rice must be at least 20 rods from all other fields of rice. Another fall a special effort will be made by all to set a grade of rice as possible to seek. All recognize now the value of such pure seed and will command a premium when the same is marketed. We are anxious to establish its purity. C. B. COOK, County Agent.
