ASSISTING LIVE STOCK BREEDERS

Various Systems and Methods of Marketing Surplus Animals Investigated.

AID UNINFORMED PURCHASER

Purchaser Needs Advice From Distant Party in Whom He Places Confidence—Bureau of Markets Inaugurating Plan.

With a view of effecting a system of communication among breeders, farmers, country agents, county agents and state and national live stock markets, various methods have been investigated by the United States Department of Agriculture through its Bureau of Markets. The desire also is to help buyers locate stock more easily.

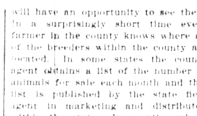

will have an opportunity to see them, and a surprisingly short time every farmer in the county knows where all of the breeders within the county are located. In some states the county agents keep a list of the number of animals for sale each month and this list is published by the state held office in marketing and distributed within the state. In counties where this plan has been most successful county agents claim to have done as much as \$5000 worth of purebred live stock sales each month.

Where the demand is not great enough to absorb the supply within a county the office is advised to employ two methods for disposing of the surplus. One is to conduct a consignment sale and sell the animals at market. The other is to advertise extensively as a purebred live stock center of county. Both methods have given excellent results.

Some consignment sales have made the mistake of selling all of their best animals privately and consigning the culls or less desirable animals to the sale. Such sales have frequently a great disadvantage and great care should be taken to offer nothing but high-class animals at consignment sales. Buyers are sure to judge the quality of a sale by the animals he consigns to the sale.

As soon as the survey is completed in a county a copy of the tabulated data is sent to the state held office in marketing. The data from the different counties are kept. The object in filing the information from each county with the state held office in marketing is to enable the state held office to answer inquiries within the state and to furnish buyers the necessary information sent in by the various county agents. The state held office of the Bureau of Markets, cooperating with the national live stock market, has been successful in bringing about a better understanding of the live stock market. The fact that these men were assured that their county would be shown high-class animals and that they would be able to sell their surplus animals to the foreign buyers will find the services of these county agents of great value in locating the kind of animals that the foreign buyers are interested in.

Data for United States Collected. The state held office in marketing of the Bureau of Markets is the repository of the Washington office of the Bureau of Markets, where it is kept on file for use in directing foreign buyers to the various live stock markets in the United States.

LIVE STOCK WEEK

Decrease in Swine Loss of 72 Per Cent Noted in Six Counties in North Carolina.

Prepared by the United States Department of Agriculture. An example of the benefit which may come to a community from the scientific efforts of state and federal agencies, equipped with the cooperation of farmers, for the control of hog cholera is shown in a recent report of the state and federal inspectors of the Bureau of Animal Industry.

Hog cholera control work was inaugurated in six counties in the northern section of North Carolina August 1, 1916. An intensive campaign was carried on for a period of 14 months. It included investigation of reported outbreaks, demonstrations in the use of serum and virus, and the disinfection of premises. As the services of practicing veterinarians were called upon, the work was withdrawn to another section of the state, only general supervision being given to the original area.

Before the start of a survey was made of the counties comprising the district in question, and a questionnaire was submitted to as many of the farmers as possible. The answers received and tabulated indicate that there has been a reduction in losses from cholera of over 72 per cent, and an increase of over 100 per cent in some production, due to the protection offered by the immunization of the animals. There has also been a

marked improvement in the type of this class of animals, due to the knowledge that it is possible to raise more and better hogs without danger of having them destroyed by cholera.

BRONCHITIS IN LITTLE PIGS. Not Much Can Be Done in Way of Treatment—Damp, Cold Pans A Cause of Trouble. Bronchitis most commonly occurs in young pigs. Matured hogs are seldom troubled with it. If it attacks very young pigs it often proves fatal, but pigs two or three months old will generally survive, though their growth may be seriously interfered with. The disease is accompanied by a distressing cough, which usually disappears with the advent of warmer weather and drier weather. Little can be done in the way of treatment. Dry pens free from drafts, nourishing food and as much exercise as possible are the principal points in preventive management.
