Modern Shorthand Had Birth in 1857.

Modern shorthand had its birth in 1857, the publication of Dr. Timothy Bright's "character" in 1857, the first English work on shorthand. Various systems of shorthand were published from that time on, all based on the a b c method, and some of them became quite popular, but with the publication of Isaac Pitman's "phonographs" based on sound and the others fell into disuse. Pitman had a number of predecessors whose systems, like his own, were strictly phonetic. These systems never gained any footing, while his immediately became popular and has since been used by a large majority of shorthand writers of English.
