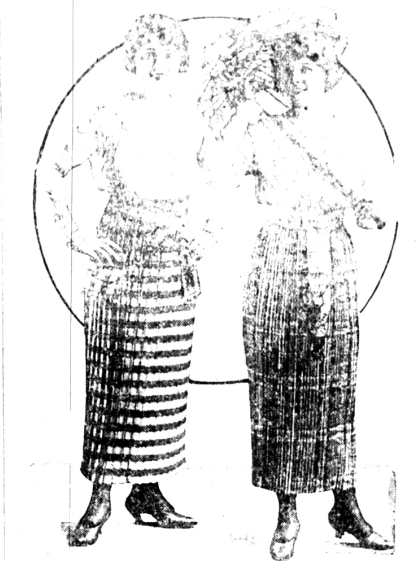
Site of Old Fort George.
