GIVE WOODWORK DILIGENT CARE

Treatment That Oiled, Painted, Waxed and Varnished Floors Should Receive.

FEW HINTS BY SPECIALISTS

Unfinished Wood Surfaces Absorb Grease and Dirt More Readily Than Those With Proper Finish—Covering for Kitchen.

Wood forms a large percentage of the surfaces that must be cared for in a home. The following suggestions made by household specialists of the United States Department of Agriculture are to help the housekeeper to preserve and keep in good condition the wood, both in the interior of the house itself and in the furniture.

Unfinished wood surfaces absorb grease and dirt more readily, are more likely to stain, and are harder to keep clean than those which have a finish of varnish, oil, paint or other such.

Scrubbing Unfinished Surfaces. A finished wood surface which is scrubbed with the grain of the wood using small quantities of water and a mild soap, rubbed with a soft brush, and then dried with a clean cloth, will retain its natural beauty and will not absorb water.



Do Not Use Too Much Water on Any Woodwork.

Be finished with a good solution, which is prepared by mixing one part of linseed oil with two parts of turpentine, and then adding one part of alcohol.

PRECAUTIONS IN USE OF PRESSURE COOKER

Specialists Outline Some Useful Canning Hints.

Uniform Pressure May Be Maintained During Sterilizing Period by Manipulation of Gas or Oil Flame or Moving Canner.

To secure the best results in the operation of steam pressure canners containing in glass jars, the following precautions should be observed:

Have the water come to the platform, but not above it, add hot water necessary to prevent the boiling tray before the lid is fastened down.
