President Frank S. Kedzie, of the Michigan Agricultural College says:

I am not favorable to the anti-parochical amendment for three main reasons:

First: Interferes with religious liberty. Second: Introduces one more element tending to unrest.

Third: Would lessen education facilities for the younger generation.

President McKenny, of the Michigan State Normal School says

This amendment if carried would shut out thousands of children because of no public school buildings to accomodate them. Another reason is that there is no more loyal group of men in America than those who come from parochical or private schools. One fourth of the men in the late world war who tought for America came from parochial and private schools.
