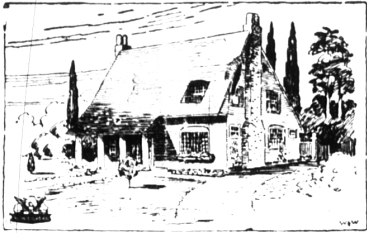


## Social and Personal
