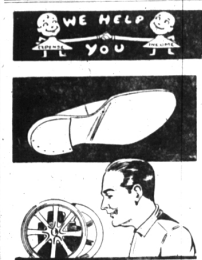


Drop Shoes Inside

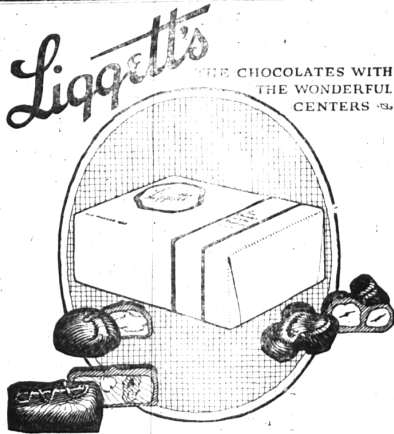

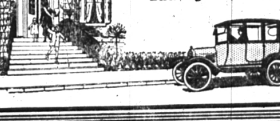
