The plans of the Village Commission to extend the present water system to a point where it is needed for the new plant of the Michigan Inspection Bureau will be complied with were given out by the Village Engineer, C. G. Commissioners Schlaack and C. A. Aided by facts and data gathered after long research by Village Manager J. H. Barnett, the Commission believes it has at last found a way to give the water to the Michigan Bureau for its annual water shortage problem.
