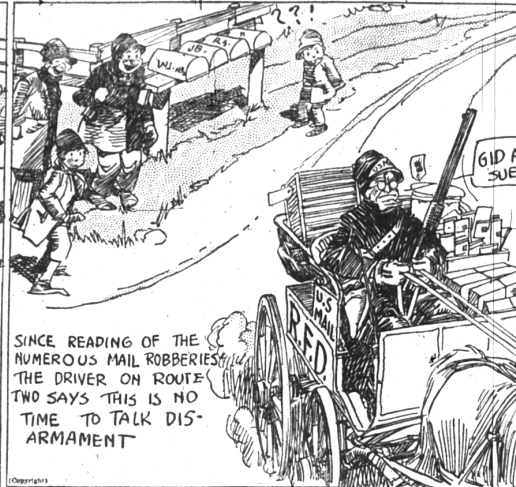


While Others Talk Disarmament
