FERNDALE MOVIE MAN IS NOW IN LOS ANGELES

Tried To Cut Out Newspaper Advertising But Lost a Roll of Money

The financial affairs of Fred Rowley, manager of the Ferndale theatre, who disappeared nearly two months ago, are reported as considerably involved. The latest development in the rather abrupt departure of Rowley is the calling of notes which he made to banks and which he persuaded Ferndale merchants to endorse. With his absence, the notes are becoming due and the men who kindly went his security, are being called on to make the amounts good. Rowley introduced several innovations in his management of the new theatre, one of which was to do away with direct newspaper advertising and substitute personal letter advertising in its stead. This feature cost him more than a hundred dollars a week in excess of what newspaper advertising would have cost. It did not pay in the end.

One man who went to the trouble and expense of hiring detectives, states that Rowley is in Los Angeles and that he can lay his hands on him at any time. His wife has been chosen as a businesswoman, wore fine clothes, drove a "car" and usually carried a large roll of money, appearing very prosperous. He found it no hard matter to get endorsements on his notes.

NEW WOODWARD AVENUE GROCERY DOING BUSINESS

The new grocery, located at 211 South Woodward avenue, is doing a nice business. The store is in a new building recently erected by William McCallum, local business man. It stands on the south side of the Marquette garage and is a one-story stucco building 20x50 feet. The proprietor is H. R. Jagger, a former employee of the Oakland Motor Car Co., at Pontiac.
