NEW BAPTIST CHURCH AIM FOR NEAR FUTURE

During the past winter the Baptist Church, Birmingham, located on Willets street, at the foot of Chester street, has been exceptionally active in affairs that admitted the public, the returns from which have been devoted to the building fund for the purpose of erecting a new church structure in the near future.

There have been entertainments of all kinds in the church parlors, both by the young people and by the various societies of the older members. Dinners, plays, and other pictures, electric rides, social affairs to which outside young people were invited, bazaar sales, fancy work selling, and many other kinds of affairs have been materially helpful to the church.

For the past two years the church has grown in every way, so that at the present time it is entirely out of debt, so far as the present structure is concerned. Considering this unusual growth, it seemed advisable this spring to purchase a building site which embraced the property at the corner of West Maple avenue and Chester street, formerly owned by S. H. Wightman. The church is at present realizing an income from the investment, having leased the dwelling on the lot.

The women of the church have recently formed into three divisions for the building. In starting the work of various kinds for raising funds for the building, their proposed schedule, which has been planned rather extensively, the women gave a supper in the church last night, which was a success beyond anticipation. Within the next few weeks the members of this organization are planning to raise \$10,000 by launching an extensive campaign. Another feature of the activity which has received much attention and co-operation for the past six weeks has been the membership contest between the Philathea Class and the Baraca Class. It was announced this week the victory of the Philathea Class with a total of 10 new members. Last evening, (Thursday) the Baraca Class gave a supper, the chairs of which were present dozens of young people interested in the welfare of the organization.

At a meeting of the Baptist young people held recently, Miss Mildred Footlocker was elected president for the ensuing year. Miss Beatrice Olson has been chosen as secretary. The Union has been one of the active societies in the community this past winter. At present they are planning a Footlocker and a Mildred Olson campaign in July, as a delegate to the national convention.
