WATER RESTRICTIONS VOTED ON BY VILLAGE OFFICIALS

The Village Commission, at a special meeting Wednesday night, passed an ordinance regulating the use of water in the Village of Birmingham to affect all users of Village water. It is in the following words:

"I would like to have it known," said President Clizbe, "that we are not doing this because Birmingham has not sufficient available water but because our mains are not large enough to afford the every-day use of water through a hose at the same time. We have divided the town into four sections and, if all comply with this ordinance, there will be little hardship felt among our residents."

The regular adjourned meeting was held on May 25, 1921.

Present: Clizbe, Brown, Manager W. H. Brown and K. Van Zandt, Clerk.

Moved by Clizbe that Ordinance No. 92 be adopted.

It is ordained by the Village of Birmingham that Ordinance No. 80 be repealed and that section 20 in Ordinance No. 73 be hereby amended and made to read as follows:

Section 20. Hose for sprinkling purposes must be equipped with and to exceed "a" nozzle or some other sprinkling device that will not consume more water than a "a" nozzle. No hose shall be used without a nozzle. Where hose is not held in hand it must emit water in a spray.

Females may use for cleaning porches and other similar purposes. No person shall use water for any other purpose at any time and any violation of the rule shall be subject to a fine of \$100.00 in addition to the other penalties provided for in the ordinance.

In case the fire alarm is sounded every hose on an other hose on the fire hose must be shut off immediately and remain shut off until the fire is extinguished.

Readers and readers are notified that water may be used for sprinkling as follows:

First—Those located North of W. Maple Street and West of Woodward Ave. from 6 o'clock A. M. and 7 o'clock P. M.

Second—Those South of W. Maple Street and West of Woodward Ave. from 6 o'clock A. M. and 7 o'clock P. M.

Third—Those South of E. Maple and East of Woodward Ave. from 6 o'clock A. M. and 7 o'clock P. M.
