waist of something else, my sleeves of some kind of crinoline that stands out quite a way from the body like two balloons. She wraps the trailing skirt around her legs and carries it a very dainty way, and appears very satisfied and happy. She wears almost any kind of shoes, without any sort of fit or style, and it is just the same to her. Imagine, if you can, the joy of these women trying to navigate in high-heeled shoes. The Japanese men wear "kimonos" clothes almost entirely, and make a fair job of it. The Japanese for the most part, wear the same kind of clothes as we do, but they are accustomed to, and look equally well. The Chinese are all good business men, all hard workers, and are making money and saving it, which is the most important thing. The Japanese in the clerical positions, and you find them in the stores, offices, and banks. The Japanese laborers, for the most part, are employed on the plantations, although they are great fishermen. The other races than those I have mentioned, I had not so familiar with, so cannot go into details about them. Those I have written about are the most important, and worth while. Many of the Hawaiian men wear feather bands on their heads, and these are very formerly worn by the chiefs and notable men, and this is, no doubt, remnant of more greatness. These hat bands are quite expensive, costing as much as ten and twelve dollars each. I had thought of buying one for each of my friends in Birmingham, but when I learned the price, I decided to buy my own hat bands instead. There are six thousand automobiles on this island and most of them are the most important, and worth while. I have found little to criticize here, but when a person buys a pound of candy with the intention of having a feast, leaves it on his dresser for a few hours, and then when he is ready to eat it, finds it has become moldy, he is not likely to eat it, unless you include the present.
