RED CROSS WORKING FOR HEALTHIER U. S.

Thousands Aided by Instruction in Care of the Sick, Food Selection and First Aid.

How the American Red Cross guides thousands of persons to health is shown in a summary of the society's work in the field based upon the annual report for the past year. Through its Nursing Service, its Home Hygiene and Care of the Sick courses, life-saving classes, First Aid courses and its many other health centers and in many other ways designed to acquaint masses of citizens with proper methods of living, the Red Cross carried its message of health into all parts of the country.

In addition to the nurses enrolled in the Red Cross for Government service, the Red Cross itself employed a total of 1,348 public health nurses in the United States and Europe.

Home Hygiene and Care of the Sick classes involving thorough instruction in the proper care of the sick in instances where the illness is not serious as to require professional nursing care, during the fiscal year numbered 1,179.
