At the Oakland
It is a wildly hilarious comic that Buster Keaton presents in "The Haunted House" the fifth of his series of two-reel juggle-getters, which comes to the Oakland Theatre, Pontiac, next Thursday, the 20th.

This latest offering of funnies is characterized by that same "bragging" slapstick and mechanical ingenuity which marked his other reels and makes the Keaton comedies stand out as the premier "stunts" of humor. The action is fast and furious with Buster always at the center of the hectic disturbance.

"The Haunted House" deals in a highly entertaining and picturesque manner with the traditional ghosts which are supposed to make a rendezvous out of a ramshackle dwelling, but which in reality is being used as the den of a gang of counterfeiters.
