VILLAGE TO INSTALL	

To forestall threats of an impending lawsuit against the village of Birmingham, property owners along the new subdivision opened up the south end there fronting toward avenue members of the village commission Wednesday night passed resolutions to install a complete sanitary sewer system in the south part sewer will flow . When completed, this sewer on Frank street, thence into the big septic tank west of Southfield avenue.

This sanitary sewer will cover about two miles of territory, and will be built by Lincoln Avenue, from Woodward avenue to Pierce street, Clark and Floyd streets, on George street, from Ann road to Pierce street; on Ann from Woodward

South of Frank street, it will be necessary to install a sump well and pump, to cost about \$100,000, an alley just west of Woodward avenue, just off Lincoln avenue. This pump will take the sewage and propel it through a special steel pipe into the Frank street trunk sewer, after which the natural flow will carry it into the sewer line.

For many years the sewage from the affected section of Birmingham has emptied into the storm sewers, then through the storm sewer into the Woodward alley, an open ditch along the Woodward alley. This sewage, which is a menace to the health of the residents of the territory south of Woodward, then flowed for a considerable distance along Woodward avenue, finally discharging into the Deep River just north of the Deep River JAFFE.

Members of the Village Commission are making every effort to get the preliminary work finished so that ground can be broken for this new sanitary sewer before the winter sets in.

**DEPUTY SHERIFF SCHNELL  
SHOT BY ESCAPING CONVICTS**

**Officer Has Second Narrow Escape  
From Death At The Hands  
Of Italian Bandits**

Deputy Sheriff Lawrence Schnell was shot down and thrown out of his automobile, at an early hour last Saturday morning, while performing a act of courtesy in helping two strangers who apparently had run out of gasoline and appeared to be stranded, just north of the village of Hesperia. His injuries were considered probably fatal.

He had left the sheriff's office at Pontiac at 12:20 Friday night, preparatory to driving his automobile to his home at Ferndale, and had reached a point a few miles north of there, when he saw a Buick car along the road and

When he had driven about a mile was attacked from behind and five shots were fired into him. He was

thrown out at the foot of Barrer's hill, and lay alongside the road some minutes, when the north- and midnight motorbus picked him and took him to the Pontiac city hospital.

later on it developed that the plotting was done by Ed Weisman, 22, and Tony Yarnick, 24, both of whom had been in the city since the assassination.

...car which broke down, were fleeing on foot when the cars came upon them. In the end, one of the Italians was killed. Schnell was shot twice, in the arm, which was permanently injured. He was laid up three days from injuries, and only a few days recovered.
