It is lucky to receive the unexpected gift of an Easter egg.

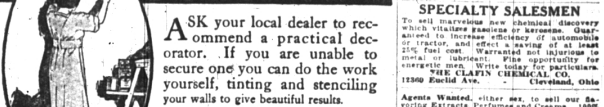
