

LIVE STOCK NEWS

PREVENT BIG SHEEP LOSSES

Poisonous Plants Frequently Grow in Thick Patches and Cause Death of Animals.

Death canna causes heavy losses of sheep in the spring and early summer. It is not unusual for several hundred to die within a day or two. The canna plants frequently grow in thick patches, and because of their grasslike leaves are overlooked. If sheep are close-hoed, in such places many of them will be poisoned, and most of those poisoned are likely to die.

Special care should be used when sheep are taken from the area and released for grazing. If they have not been fed, as is frequently the case, and are turned out on a range where death canna is abundant, the resulting losses may be very heavy. There have been many cases of this kind. If death canna is present that part of the range should be avoided, if it is necessary to trail sheep where death canna is known, the animals should be well fed before coming to that place.

Sheep herders should learn to recognize the plants and avoid them. The United States Department of Agriculture has published Department Bulletin 125, Zygadenus, or Death Canna, which tells about the plants and their effects; It has also published Bulletin 373, Stock-Poisoning Plants of the Range, which gives illustrations of many of the principal poisonous plants of the western United States.

There are several kinds of death canna and until recently it has been supposed that all were equally poisonous. As the result of recent experimental work, which is in course of publication, it has been found that the death canna which in the western

mountain grows at elevations of 8,000 feet and upward is only slightly poisonous and probably never injures range sheep. All the forms growing at lower altitudes are dangerous, but this mountain death canna probably never does any harm. It has thin and erect leaves, grows in meadows and in damp ground, sometimes among the aspens, while the other kind, which approaches the lower limit of the mountain death canna, grows in dry places, and has thick, spreading leaves. The herder need not fear the mountain death canna, but should shun all the other forms.

GREAT FEED VALUE OF PEAS

Results of Four Years' Experimental Work at Idaho Station Show Big Gains Made.

That field peas have a high value as a feed for hogs is indicated by the results of four years' experimental work at the Idaho experiment station. An average of 347 pounds of peas was required to make 100 pounds of gain in hogging-off trials. Supplemental rations of barley and tankage increased the rate of gain. Most rapid and economical gains were produced in drylots on a mixture of 3 parts of rolled barley and 1 part of cracked peas plus 5 per cent by weight of tankage. In the hogging-off trials the best results were obtained by confining the pigs to a small area until it was pastured clean.

TREATMENT FOR YOUNG LAMB

When Chilled It May Be Revived by Immersing in Warm Water, Then Give Nourishment.

A young lamb that has become chilled and is presumably dead to all intents and purposes may be revived by immersing it in warm water—as warm as is comfortable to the hand—and gradually increasing the heat a little at a time, by adding more warm water.

When it revives sufficiently, dry it well, wrap in a woolen cloth and lay it in a warm place, if it will permit, in a short time and can then be taken to ewe, held her, and see that the lamb gets nourishment.

Later the same very fine cure often respond to this treatment.

PREVENT HOGS FROM ROOTING

Much Harm Can Be Avoided by Feeding Regularly With Some Kind of Mineral.

Pigs are more apt to be "rooters" in spring when ground is soft than they are at any other time of the year. Much of this can be prevented by feeding regularly with coal, charcoal, saler or other mineral matter. Ringing the hogs should be resorted to in extreme cases.

Plant Vines at One Side. Vines, like squashes and cucumbers, are planted on one side or at one end, and they will interfere least with other crops.

Exercise Needed by Ewes. The ewes should be encouraged to take plenty of exercise. Without exercise pregnant ewes soon become inactive.

Time to Clean Seed Grain. Clean the seed grain. Now is a good time.

QUEER FREAKS OF NATURE

River of Pure Ink in Algeria—Siberian Streams Flow Over Beds of Solid Ice—Singing Well.

A river of ink is formed in Algeria by the union of two streams, the water of one being impregnated with iron and the other, which drains a great swamp, with gallic acid. This combination of iron and acid forms a pure ink. In Siberian rivers there are ice and sand beds. A tributary of the Lena river has underneath the soil which forms the bed of the river, a bed of pure ice, over nine feet thick. A freak of nature in western Kentucky. It is known as the Hidden River, because no one knows its origin, and it vanishes into a cave leading no one knows where. It flows without a ripple, and is of a pale, bluish color. A singing well is one of the natural curiosities of Texas. In fine weather a sound like that of an acolian harp is given out by the well. At times the sound is clear; then it recedes, as if far away; and then it reaches the ear very faintly. These changes take place every few minutes, and with great regularity.

With an east wind blowing the water in the well gets very low, and the mysterious musical sound is faint. A strong west wind causes the water to rise and the sound to increase in volume and clearness. Before a north wind the well plays its wildest pranks. The water rises nearly to the top of the well, which is about sixty feet deep, and gives out a loud, wailing sound.

Safeguarding the Mules.

Ludicrous as it may seem, necessity has demanded that a Los Angeles driver equip his mules with tail lights, says Popular Mechanics Magazine. Without being facetious, it may not be amiss to point out that the devices employed are literally the first real tail lights ever used. Some time ago when a number of the man's mules were being driven along a highway at night, a motor car plunged into the ditch with disastrous results. This caused the dealer to resort to the warring lights so as to avoid similar accidents in the future. The devices, which are identical to those used on many bicycles, are strapped to the mule's tails. When the glare from the lamps of a motor car strikes them, beams of ruby light are reflected. Incidentally, if a mule swings his tail, the warning signal becomes all the more noticeable.

Chief Fared Stage of Paris.

A woman shoplifter who was caught in the act of appropriating a curtain from a fur's emporium was sentenced to ten months' imprisonment. An enormous quantity of stolen objects, consisting chiefly of provisions and articles of clothing, was found at her apartment. Her excuse before the judge was that the articles had been laid in by her as a precaution against a strike of Paris, an argument which failed to move the court.
