GRANT HUDSON'S CAREER OFFERS MANY CONTRASTS

Congressional Candidate Has Had Wide Experience in Business, Farming and Public Affairs.

Grant M. Hudson, a candidate for the Republican nomination for Congress from this district, was born on a farm near Okemaw, Mich., in 1870.

As a young man, he learned the farmer's trade, and it was while following his trade that he first acquired the advantages of higher education.

Determined to realize his ambition along this line, he worked his way through Kalamazoo College, graduating in 1894, and then entered the University of Chicago for his master's degree.

Because of ill-health, he was obliged to discontinue his college work, and took up farming in Kalamazoo county. In 1897, he entered the mercantile field at Schoolcraft, Mich., in a small way, the business prospering and developing to a point where it was the largest mercantile establishment in that section.

While he was in Schoolcraft, Mr. Hudson was a member of the school board, member of the college of trustees and president of the village three terms, and represented his county in the State legislature during the sessions of 1905 and 1907, as well as the special session of 1908.

In the legislature, he was father of what was then widely known as the Hudson Local Option Bill. He took an active part in the establishment of the bills providing for a two-cent railroad fare and for direct taxation in Ligonier.

In 1910, Mr. Hudson was superintendent of the Detroit district of the Anti-Saloon League, and in 1911 became state superintendent when the headquarters were removed to Lansing. The anti-saloon league wide constitutional dry amendment was accomplished under his leadership.

He resigned from the superintendency of the Anti-Saloon League in 1913 and was appointed deputy state superintendent of the Michigan State Industrial Accident Commission. He served in that capacity until the summer of 1920, when he became general director of the Michigan Baptist Convention. This position calls for a large amount of executive ability, and places him in active business contact with the representative bodies of the Baptist denomination throughout the entire state.

Since Mr. Hudson sold out his mercantile business, he has been actively interested in agricultural problems. He is thoroughly familiar with all phases of farming and farm management, and has continuously operated a farm for many years. His holdings now comprising 320 acres.

Mr. Hudson has always been interested in educational matters, and holds an honorary degree from Hillsdale college. He is a trustee of both Kalamazoo and Hillsdale colleges, and was for some time on the board of control of the State School for the Blind. While in the legislature, he was especially active in behalf of the Industrial School for Boys, and took a leading part in the establishment of the Western State Normal.

This spring, his home community, the city of East Lansing, elected him a member of the council, and it has paid him an unparalleled tribute in recent weeks in that every year 1000 building voters who could be reached, with but two exceptions, signed the Hudson congressional nominating petitions.

Mr. Hudson is a typical self-made American citizen, who has achieved success through hard work and public office through recognized public service. His wide experience in business, farming, and public affairs admirably fit him for membership in Congress as representative of the sixth district.
